## What I Need to Do to Drive My IEP Meeting in 10 Easy Steps

# 1. Begin By Greeting Everyone and Stating Purpose of the Meeting.

"Welcome to my meeting. Today we are going to plan my program for the next year."

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2. Introduce Yourself and Others.

3. Identify Your After-Graduation Goals.

4. Review How You Have Been Doing in School.

NOTE TO STUDENT: Ask questions if you don't understand something that is said.
6. Identify Your Goals for This Year.
"This year in school I want to

7. Identify the Supports You Need to be Successful
"For me to be successful in school this year, I need
"Any comments or questions?"
8.Summarize Your Goals.
"In summary, my future plans are to
"For me to make progress toward these goals, I will do these things this year:

#### 9. Review Support Needs and Finalize Program
